The theaters have bounched a new drive to captivate the hearts and minds of the public, by introducing the "Drive-In-Theater" by the way-side with ample parking space for hundreds of cars. The showmen are doing what the Church was commanded to do—"Go out in the highways and hedges and compel them to come in."

The writer returned from the mission field a few weeks ago. To my utter surprise I discovered Communistic literature in the hands of the natives, which promised them a bright future if they would but accept the offer. Furthermore, the American liquor interests had the shelves of native saloons loaded down with the American brands of heer and whiskey. Leaders of false cults and doctrines had already made their way to the interior, and had deceived many. It is our aim to have the MISSIONARY STANDARD published in Spanish for the benefit of our native Christians. A native printer has already offered to do our printing in Cuba for a small sum, as God favored us with a great revival in their

town during the winter months, thru which a number of his relatives were converted. He, too is a candidate for salvation, and covets the prayers of God's people for deliverance from sin.

GOD'S MISSIONARY STANDARD, an eight page monthly paper, will keep you well informed of the great work the church is doing at home and abroad. I trust that this NEW VEN-TURE OF FAITH will prove a great blessing to all who subscribe for the STANDARD. In the closing hours of this dispensation with the eveaing sun fast setting, shall we lift up our heads, join hands, and do our best to prompte His great work, and spread Scriptural holiness and revival literature in which Jesus will be exalted and the Holy Ghost honored. "The Glory of His Presence"

Text—John 14:23 "If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him."

Here we have portrayed the marvel of Christ's condescension and abode. The Psalmist David while musing over the goodness of God and the interest of God in sinful, fallen humanity, spake these words: "What is man that thou art mindful of him?" Solomon, known as the wisest of all men declared: "But will God in very deed dwell with man on the earth?" II Chronicles 6:18. Paul, the great apostle to the Gentiles, spoke of the mystery of Godliness. Undoubtedly, his conversion had made such a profound impression upon his mind and heart, that he felt it to be the greatest mystery of all times. Jesus said on one occasion: "The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, or whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit."

Whether we be rich or poor, learned or unlearned, the one and most important thing is His presence. His presence, however, is conditional, and unless we meet the required conditions, we need not expect His presence.

(1) Let us remember, the disciples had left all to follow Jesus. This meant turning their backs on kinfolk, their earthly ambitions, and all that would stand between them and their Master.

(2) They had believed the sayings and teachings of Christ, "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." If we are to enjoy His constant presence, it means we must believe and live according to the teachings of the Sayiour.

(3) The disciples of Jesus were not of the world. That is to say: the worldly spirit that had formerly indwelt their hearts, had been dealt with by the regenerating power of God in their lives. The three great evils relative to the world are: "The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye, and the pride of life." These having been subdued, they enjoyed blessed victory over the world. Our greatest enemy lies embedded in our own bosom, and until we have it cared for by the regenerating

and sanctifying power of Christ, we will be the defeated victim of Satan.

***Let us note the meaning of the glory of His presence . . . What does His presence imply? Surely the message of the angel in regards to Jesus was not a mere insertion of words to fill space in Holy writ. "He shall save his people from their sins" is the message that has been testified to by thousands, yea millions, of adherents to the Christian faith. (1) His presence means deliverance from sin, both actual and original. Any religion that does not save it's adherents from their sins is a farce and is false. Multitudes of professed Christians claim that they must sin every day in word, thought, and deed. If that be the case, the coming of Jesus into the world to suffer and die was a sad failure. I John 3:9 "Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God." If there is any criticism to be offered by the reader, let it be remembered, it is to justify himse'f. God help us to come out into the clear for God.

(2) His presence means absence of darkness and presence of His marvelous light. How many there are who profess to know Him and to love Him. yet their lives are out of harmony with the Word of God. Luke 1:79 "To give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death." These words were not spoken amiss, but have a literal interpretation. The Psalmist said, "The Lord is my light and my salvation." Hear me, reader friend, if we are out of sorts, or have an ill feeling toward a brother or a sister, then let us take heed, for Jesus said that he that hateth his brother is a murderer. Sad to say, there are multitudes in the ranks of religionists who have carried ill feelings toward a pastor, evangelist, or brother or sister in the church, and go right on professing over the top of it all. Let us quit fooling ourselves: he that is in the Light loveth his brother. Yes, I will proceed a step further; he even prays for his enemies. Amen.

(3) Again His presence speaks of comfort. We are living in a cold, selfish world. Indeed it is not

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR MISSIONARY WORK IN CUBA

For a number of years our churches have been supporting foreign missions among various denominations, and in several different parts of the world. However, the past few years our brethren and churches have felt the need of a work of our own. Five years ago our Supt. Rev. Geo. I. Straub, being providentially led to the Island of Cuba, found it to be a land of wonderful opportunity in the possibility of starting a work there under supervision of God's Missionary Church. This, however, did not materialize until the month of January, this year of 1949, when Reverend Straub, Brother Clair Bailey, and the writer made a visit to this island of five million people, many of whom are lost in heathen darkness and sin.

Rev. Paul H. Eversole, our representative and missionary worker, had been to the authorities of the Cuban government and made all arrangements necessary for our incorporation in the island. Upon our arrival this past January, we found all things in readiness. Papers were signed, the legal procedures pursued, the required sum of money paid, and we are happy to tell our readers of the MISSIONARY STANDARD that we have a field to which we can send those who have a missionary call. At the time of this writing, we have two churches which are active and conducting regular services. Both of these churches are located near Bejucal, Cuba, a village of about

20,000, located within an hour's drive of the capital city of Havana. We conducted services in both of these churches, and found people that love and serve God. Bro. Manola and Sister Pauline are the pastors of these churches. You that know how to pray, will you pray for these workers?

From Bejucal, we took a train to Eastern Orienta, Cuba, a distance of about five hundred miles. Our trip was a thrilling one, at least to the writer. After going as far as possible by train, we took a taxi. At one time we came to a stream, which was not bridged. There was no way of getting to our destination, we were told, without crossing this stream, and it was a rushing torrent. The taxi driver got out and shook his head as much as to say that he didn't know if he could drive across. Finally, we risked it, forded the stream with the water rushing over the running boards, and climbed up the slippery bank on the other side. We arrived at our destination after about twenty-four hours of traveling. We found all things in readiness for a revival service, as Reverend Eversole had preceded us to this town. The meeting was started, and in a few nights the altar was lined with seeking souls. A number prayed thru to wonderful victory, as God saves the natives just as He does us. When the victory was won, they

shed their lipstick, jewelry, and other worldly habits. The American people might be able to learn a lesson from this. Amen. Brother Straub and the writer stayed at this place about two weeks, and then had to start back for Havana, and the United States. However, the revival continued with Reverend Eversole, and Brother Bailey. Reports of victory have been noted in their letters to us. Surely it was sad to leave these precious, needy people, who are so hungry for the Gospel. We are trusting God to stir the hearts of the readers, until some will get the call to go as missionaries to these people. If you are not called, lay aside a few dollars and help to support this needy cause and field.

Since we were privileged to visit this island and see the great need, and have been recognized and incorporated by the Cuban government, we feel the need of a means of transportation, for this island, so that we may reach more people with less expense, as travel by taxi and train is high. Our missionary has decided we need a truck on the order of a station wagon, and has suggested a Chevrolet Carryall Suburban. This can be used as a means of transporting materials in building and erecting new churches, as well as a personnel carrier. The truck has been ordered, and we are expecting it's arrival sometime this month. The total cost is \$1750.00, plus the freight charges in getting it to Cuba. We already have a good part of this

amount, but still need about a thousand dollars or more for the truck, and funds for some additional items so much needed on the mission field, including: a typewriter and a washing machine. If God should speak to you concerning these needs, will you kindly pray about them, and do as He lays the matter upon your hearts. The Cuban government has given us six months time to get our necessary equipment on the field. If we get it there inside of six months we need not pay import charges. May the Lord help us to work, pray, and give, that this cause may be established, and many souls be saved before Jesus comes. Send all offerings for foreign missionary work to:-Rev. 
THE ANNUAL PENNS CREEK CAMP, PENNS CREEK, PA.
